Bayshore Community Hospital Dawn Smith knew she was in good hands when she had her back surgery at Bayshore.

DAWN SMITH OF TINTON FALLS HADN’T BEEN IN A HOSPITAL SINCE HER SON was born 31 years ago. She has led an active lifestyle — walking, biking, keeping up with her three grandchildren, serving at her church, and volunteering in the community. So when pain in her lower back became unbearable, with no relief from stretching or from the chiropractor, she knew she needed answers.

“I’ve had problems with my lower back for years. I traveled a lot for my job with many trips back and forth to the D.C. area, so I attributed the irritation to long car rides,” Dawn says. “I went for an MRI and saw a few different back and pain specialists who all told me that I needed surgery.”

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Expertise Brings Peace of Mind

Dawn quickly met with Nasser Ani, M.D., a board certified orthopedic and spine surgeon with 24 years of experience on staff at Bayshore Community Hospital, who diagnosed her with a ruptured disc. “A ruptured disc occurs when the spinal disc

breaks down and the inner core of the disc leaks out through the outer portion,” Dr. Ani says. “Pieces of Dawn’s disc had broken off and invaded the spine, causing extreme pressure on the nerves.”

“When he looked at my MRI films, he too recommended surgery. I knew I couldn’t ignore the pain any longer, so if surgery was the recommended treatment, that’s what I was going to do,” Dawn says.

On April 30, 2013, Dawn arrived at Bayshore for a microdiscectomy. According to Dr. Ani, microdiscectomy is a type of lumbar herniated disc surgery designed to take pressure off the nerve in which a small portion of the disc is removed. In Dawn’s case, four pieces of the disc were removed. The procedure is minimally invasive.
